## Alleluia, He is Risen.

Easter Sunday 2020

We have come the end of a rather extraordinary and difficult Holy Week and I hope that many of you have managed to keep in touch through the various live streamed services available on the internet.

As we now come to Easter Sunday and faced with the effect the coronavirus has had on our lives, I don't suppose many of us feel like shouting 'Alleluia'. Nevertheless, I believe the Easter story has a powerful message for us today.

I have been reflecting on what it must have been like on that First Easter Morning. The disciples, having witnessed Jesus', suffering and cruel death on the cross, must have felt that life as they knew it had come to an end-all their hopes and dreams for the future dashed. Furthermore, they fear for their own safety and isolate themselves by locking themselves away in an upper room. Then something extraordinary happens, they hear from the women that the tomb is empty, and they had been told by an angel that Jesus had risen. There is bewilderment, confusion and disbelief, what is going on? Eventually, the Risen Lord appears to the disciples in the upper room. His words: 'Peace be with you. Do not be afraid, it is I'. He helps them to grow in understanding of the true meaning of his suffering and death. Then, strengthened by the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, the disciples leave their isolation and rush into the streets to tell everyone they meet about their experience.

As we arrive at Easter this year, we need to hear the Lord speaking to us in our difficulty: 'Peace be with you. Do not be afraid, it is I'. Let us pray for each other during this Easter Season that the Risen Lord will help us to recognise his presence with us and that by reflecting on his words, our faith and trust in him may be strengthened. Let us also pray that we, like the disciples, may soon be able to leave our isolation and come together with renewed faith to give witness, glory and praise to the Risen Lord.

May the blessing and peace of the risen Lord be with you all.
